Genesis' story of Joseph (Chapter 37-50) is a finely wrought and self-contained novella. It describes in detail the development of his personality and character from a shallow youth to compassionate adulthood. Within is really the story of a family's survival.

Everyone has known someone like the young Joseph. A gifted child, doted upon by adults, envied and resented by other youth. Gen. 37:1-6 describes how the charismatic adolescent impressed with his intelligence and limitless self-confidence. He simultaneously alienated others with his own self-absorption.

There is desire that Joseph will bring new status and hope to the family. However, the first thing taught about him turns out to be disturbing. When spending time with his half-brothers, afterwards, when back at home, he divulges evil gossip. No one likes a rat - snitches get stitches. An aging father's obvious favorite younger son sought to further enhance his own standing by throwing his older half-brothers under the chariot (37:2).

The ratting out of brothers is followed by the gifting of a fine coat with long sleeves, the luxurious kind as worn by nobility (37:3). It was a piece of clothing which would never be envisioned being worn to do manual labor. Jacob's preferential love of Jospeh would make it impossible for him to coexist within the family because of the strong emotions it generated. Joe then compounds an already precarious situation by boasting about his dreams (37:5-11). He reveals in the first dream how he becomes elevated over all his adult brothers. The second one include his parents in an act of worshipping Joseph.

Joseph consistently provokes his older brothers by exploiting his privileged position granted by their father. Seemingly lost to hatred and resentment, the whole family begins a painful, stretched out, journey to self-knowledge that will ultimately bring them all to a place of peace.

Gen. 34 illustrates how when pushed, the older sons of Jacob resort to violence. Jacob sends Jospeh to his older brothers who are pasturing flocks several days' travel away. When Joseph appears before them so far away from everything else they resolve to dispose of him and make it look like an accident.

Gen. 37:18-36 conflates two traditions that credit Reuben and Judah as seeking to save Joseph's life. They persuade the others to sell Joe to strangers making their way down to Egypt. How can family, no matter how provoked, sell their own brother into slavery? Studying these scriptures closely allows for the discovery that they are more subtle and complex than a Jerry Springer episode of evil older brothers conspiring against an innocent younger one. As witnessed in our own times, sibling rivalry is a symptom of deep-seated family conflict that has long simmered, often for generations. The seeds of contention between Jacob's sons have been sown years before by their parents. It will be decades before the full cycle of revenge and forgiveness will be completed.

The troubled dynamics of Jacob's family reflect contemporary domestic issues. It speaks to the universality of the curse and blessing possible within families. While the Bible paints an unapologetic view of poor parenting and wrathful action, it also points to the possibilities of reconciliation and forgiveness. God can make recovery possible from brokenness borne out through our own bad choices. And such healing does not require decades, famine, enslavement and imprisonment. Healing is always possible.
